



Veterans & Dependents Checklist

- Complete VA Application for GI Bill® benefits and Packet of Veterans Information Forms from the COTC School Certifying Official in the Office of Financial Aid.
- Discuss estimated GI Bill® benefits with the School Certifying Official (Note: the VA will determine your eligibility and amount of benefits).
- File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) at www.fafsa.ed.gov
 - All students are eligible for a student loan if they meet the following criteria:
Enrolled in an eligible program, enrolled for at least 6 credit hours, do not owe a repayment or overpayment on a federal grant, making Satisfactory Academic Progress, have not reached aggregate loan limit, and are not in default on a federal student loan.
Dependent Student Loan Amount: \$5500 for the academic year.
Independent Student Loan Amount: \$9500 for the academic year.
 - What is your estimated student loan debt? (Discuss with the Office of Financial Aid and access the National Student Loan Data System at www.nslds.ed.gov)
- Meet with an Academic Advisor in the Gateway regarding program of interest.
 - Academic Advisor will cover admission application, placement testing, orientation and course registration.
 - Academic Advisor will provide a Plan of Study for the program of interest, along with necessary requirements to graduate and the expected time of completion.

- Estimated tuition/fees for the program is dependent upon current & future tuition and fee rates. Go to www.cotc.edu > Admissions > Paying for College > Tuition & Fees to see current tuition & fee information. You need to ensure your account gets into a paid status by the due date while your VA funding is in process; this can be accomplished by getting an approved COTC Intent to Pay form, finalizing financial aid, using the tuition payment plan and/or paying in full. Please be aware if your tuition is not fully covered by your VA funding source, you need to pay the difference by the standard tuition due date. - Books and Supplies: Be prepared to pay out-of-pocket for your books and supplies. The Post 9/11 GI Bill is the **ONLY** chapter that provides a book stipend, but it's **not** always available before the semester starts.
