

## ***What Happens When You Enroll Less than Fulltime or Drop Some but Not All Hours***

*(Please retain for your record)*

The Student Financial Services (SFS) Enrollment Change Policy at Central Ohio Technical College requires a student to complete all **add/drop** changes to a class by the **CENSUS DATE** of the semester. (Contact SFS for specific dates.) If a student adds or drops a class anytime up to and including this date, financial aid will be adjusted. If changes are made after this date, financial aid will not be adjusted unless a student decides to audit a class or does not attend the class. The following chart summarizes how aid is adjusted when enrollment is less than full-time.

- ◆ If a student is attempting a class for the third time after receiving a passing grade, he will not receive aid for the class on the third or later attempt.
- ◆ If a student is taking classes not on his Plan of Study, his aid may be reduced or cancelled. Speak to a Gateway Advisor to plan courses required to graduate from your current active program of study.
- ◆ The amount of aid a student is eligible for has no relationship to institutional charges or other incurred costs of attendance.
- ◆ Non-attendance is considered a reduction of hours and aid will be adjusted.
- ◆ If a student decides to audit a class any time during the semester, his aid will be reduced or cancelled.
- ◆ This policy does not apply to total withdrawals for the semester. Refer to the "Enrollment Change Policy" available at <https://www.cotc.edu/post/enrollment-change-policy>.
- ◆ Dropping and not attending classes after the census date will affect a student's Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) as monitored by Student Financial Services in accordance with Federal Regulations. Failure to meet SAP can result in the cancellation of Federal, State, and Institutional aid.
