3. Has the Title IV debt been discharged or is it dischargeable? (Dischargeable means forgiven)  
 **YES If yes, applicant is eligible for Title IV aid.** (The borrower must provide documentation from the holder of the debt stating it is dischargeable. NSLDS loan status code DB or DO.)  
 **NO** *If no, applicant must make satisfactory payment arrangements with the holder of the debt before consideration for further aid.*

Documentation is acceptable and student is TITLE IV eligible.
